



JOHN RYAN

President, Indianapolis Council of St. Vincent De Paul

John Ryan was corporation counsel and senior deputy mayor during Indianapolis mayor Bill Hudnut's administration; partner at the law firm Ice Miller, concentrating on government public affairs; vice president of government affairs for One America; and director of the Department of Child Services under Indiana Governor Mitch Daniels' administration. Since retiring, he was elected as, and is currently serving as, president of the Indianapolis Council of Saint Vincent de Paul.

Catholic widower and mother

Jennifer is a Catholic messenger of God's mercy and love. After marrying her husband, Nathan, and finding out three months later they were expecting their first child, Nathan was murdered while on a morning walk two blocks from their home in Indianapolis. Nathan never got to meet their daughter, Cecilia. Yet, even in his death, his faith continues to be a witness to others. Since his death, Jennifer has taken steps to not only forgive, but to also pray daily for his murderer. She is passionate about sharing her faith and her spiritual journey.

Archbishop Charles C. Thompson
Archdiocese of Indianapolis

Archbishop Thompson was appointed by Pope Francis in June 2017 and installed July 28. He holds bachelor's, master of divinity and licentiate of canon law degrees. Ordained a priest for the Archdiocese of Louisville in 1987, his pastoral service has included roles as associate pastor, pastor, parish administrator, priest-chaplain, Metropolitan Judicial Vicar and Director of Tribunals, Promoter of Justice and Judge of the Tribunal and visiting professor of canon law. He was Vicar General of the Archdiocese of Louisville from 2008 to 2011, and was Bishop of Evansville from 2011 to 2017, before being appointed Archbishop of Indianapolis.

TOM MONAGHAN

Founder, Legatus

He is best known as the founder of Domino's Pizza and former owner of the Detroit Tigers baseball franchise, but Tom Monaghan currently devotes his attention to not-for-profit endeavors, specifically focusing on underwriting Catholic higher education. This support primarily flows through the Ave Maria Foundation, which he founded in 1983 and for which he serves as chairman of the board. He founded what is now Ave Maria University in Florida and serves as the university's chancellor and chairman of the board for the university's law school. He founded Legatus in 1987.

Rector, Bishop Simon Bruté College Seminary, Indianapolis

Father Moriarty was ordained in 1993 and has served in a number of roles in central Indiana. He has been sacramental minister; associate pastor; chaplain of Cardinal Ritter Junior/Senior High School, Serra Club, Indianapolis Fire Department and Marian University; vocations director for the Archdiocese; and associate director of spiritual formation, spiritual director, then director of spiritual formation for Saint Meinrad Seminary and School of Theology. He is currently rector of Bishop Simon Bruté College Seminary.

at St. Vincent Health

At St. Vincent Health in Indianapolis, Elliott Bedford leads the hospital system's efforts to embody a moral identity as a ministry of the Catholic Church. He develops and integrates ethics education, consultation and development services for the health system's 20 acute-care facilities and approximately 16,000 associates. He also helps foster relationships between St. Vincent Health and the Catholic Diocese of Lafayette, Diocese of Evansville and Archdiocese of Indianapolis. In his role at St. Vincent Hospital, he works closely with ethics leaders at the hospital's parent organization, Ascension Health, the largest nonprofit health system in the United States and the world's largest Catholic health system. He is an adjunct professor in the College of Osteopathic Medicine at Marian University and holds bachelor's and master's degrees in philosophy, a master's degree in theology and a doctorate in health care ethics in the Catholic Tradition.
